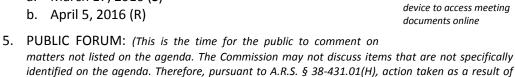

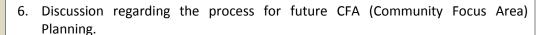

RE: Specific Planning Process Discussion

The purpose of the April 19, 2016 work session is to discuss the Planning and Zoning Commission's participation in the planning process for future Community Focus Area (CFA) plans. Since the updated Sedona Community Plan was ratified by the voters in March 2014, the City has initiated 2 CFA specific area planning projects and is currently working on the neighborhood initiated Schnebly Hill CFA plan. Specific area planning projects of this nature are generally new to the City and as such should be viewed as an ever evolving and improving process. Every CFA planning area is unique with varying objectives and conditions, which may result in different approaches and outcomes. The whole CFA planning process is at the same time visionary and strategic. At every stage, as additional information is obtained, the plan or its process and sequencing may have to be changed or adjusted. To help understand the planning process, a flow chart identifying each planning phase is attached.

Based on experience with the planning process for the Soldier Pass and Western Gateway CFA Plans below are some talking points for discussion related to the Commission's involvement in the CFA planning process:

- 1. At what point in the planning process should the Commission become involved?
- 2. Should a joint visioning session be held between the Commission and Council at the beginning of each new CFA planning process?
- 3. Should major policy concepts, such as lodging and housing be discussed prior to drafting the plan?
- 4. Should multiple alternative land use scenarios be provided prior to drafting a plan?
 - If multiple alternative land use scenarios, how do we rank each of them?
- 5. How do we address areas where there is a lack of consensus between Commissioners and the Commission and staff?
- 6. At what points in the planning process does the Commission want to see a draft plan?
 - At certain stages of evolution?
 - At certain thresholds?
 - Upon completion of a draft based on understanding of the vision and policy concept discussions?
- 7. Staff establishes an estimated time schedule for each new CFA planning process. What are some things that the Commission can do to help keep the schedule on track?
