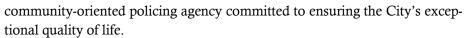


THE POSITION

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

he Chief of Police reports to the City Manager and serves as a key member of the City's Leadership Team. This position leads a team including one commander, one lieutenant, five sergeants, police officers, detectives, dispatchers, records clerk, administrative assistant, animal control officer, community services aides, and police volunteers. Together

they comprise a proud and professional force that works diligently to provide professional police services in partnership with the community. By employing its community policing/problem-solving philosophy, the department strives to work with residents, businesses, and all stakeholders to maintain community viability. The City is seeking a strong, hands-on leader with solid ethics and integrity who has the ability to focus on teamwork, respond timely to staffing requirements, and implement organizational development and modern police tactics. The Chief will be positive, energetic, and capable of working in a collaborative manner. It is expected that the new Chief will have strong communication skills, utilize community policing, provide solid leadership, and have a personality style that is comfortable in a small community.

The next Chief will be a strong leader and an outstanding administrator. The Chief will be team oriented, work with an open door, relate well to the rank and file, and lead by example. The Chief will provide consistent communication with and outreach to all City communities, promote citizen involvement and promote a successful relationship with the schools.

ing which provides the knowledge and abilities necessary to perform the work.

Must possess or be capable of obtaining an Arizona police officer certification. Candidate should possess strong administrative, financial, operational, and organizational skills, along with solid public relations/community policing experience.

THE COMMUNITY

edona is approximately one and a half hours north of Phoenix in Yavapai and Coconino Counties. Originally founded in 1902, the City was incorporated in 1988 and is one of the premier tourism, recreation, retirement, viticulture and art centers.

Its history is that of a rural community which such a beauty that Sedona became known through the motion picture industry through many classic films, commercials, and television shows.

Located in the high southwestern desert under the rim of the Colorado Plateau at an elevation of 4,500 feet, Sedona is blessed with four mild seasons, and plenty of sunshine and clean air.

The year round population of Sedona is approximately 11,000 residents,

while the seasonal/visitor population often doubles that number on a regular basis.

The City is almost nineteen square miles in size, with 51% being owned by private landowners and the rest belonging to the Coconino National Forest.

Sedona has something for everyone: world class resorts to small family-run motels, multitudes of spectacular hiking trails, fine restaurants, excellent schools, film festivals, concerts, outstanding shops and diverse art galleries.

The beauty and climate of the area (now encouraging a new and growing viticulture industry) makes sightseeing and hiking, golf, tennis, horseback riding, and off-roading year-round activities.

Statistically, the City has low crime rates and has been rated the 9th safest city in the state. Sedona also enjoys an engaged community, with many residents volunteering their time in a variety of ways.

he City of Sedona operates under the Manager-Council form of government with six Council Members and one elected Mayor. The Council appoints the City Manager, who is responsible for carrying out policy enacted by the Council, overseeing administration

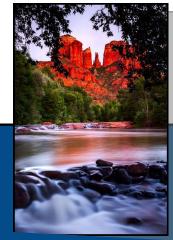
of the City, and maintaining inter-governmental relationships.

Sedona currently has a staff of 125 full-time equivalent employees and the 2016 total budget is approximately \$38 million.

City departments include the City Manager, City Attorney, City Clerk, Community Development, Public Works, Finance, Human Resources, Information Technology, Magistrate Court, Parks and Recreation, Police, and Wastewater (special districts provide fire services and water). The City has an "A" underlying rating from Standard and Poor's Rating Services on its most recent bond issuance.

The City has no property tax and relies on sales and lodging tax revenues to support its operations. The City has come out of the recession with a reduced workforce, smaller budget, and excellent reserves.

The 2016 budget reflects a commitment to maintaining core services and a continuing mindset of identifying cost-saving efficiencies and adding resources only in the most critical areas.
