

## THE POSITION

The selected candidate will plan, organize, and coordinate programs projects and initiatives aimed at reducing negative impacts to the environment and promoting long-term sustainability.

The Coordinator will manage, coordinate, facilitate, and advise the development, implementation, monitoring, and improvement of local government policies, programs, and initiatives that promote local environmental, economic, and socio-cultural sustainability.

This position will oversee the development of community education programs on sustainable practices, including energy conservation, alternative energy, waste diversion and reduction, local food production, and business efficiency programs.

The Coordinator will organize activities with departments that will accomplish all levels of conservation, solid waste recycling, green building, resource and water conservation, greenhouse gas reduction, government funding, and environmental reporting metrics.

The ideal candidate will have strong communication skills and effectively represent the City at environmental meetings and negotiate environmental permit conditions with federal, state, and local agencies.

The Coordinator will be approachable, positive, energetic, and capable of working in a collaborative manner with boards, commissions, committees, the public, or other governing boards.

# EXPERIENCE and EDUCATION



The current top salary range for the Sustainability Coordinator position is \$56,617.00 annually. Salary placement for the top candi-


date will depend on experience and education.
