Councilor Currivan stated for the record that he opposed this item because they were not shown the changes to the International Codes to evaluate them, and no cost information for a cost benefit analysis was provided.

Motion: After 1st reading, Councilor Williamson moved to approve Ordinance 2019-05, an Ordinance of the Mayor and Council of the City of Sedona, Arizona adopting proposed amendments to Article 15 of the Sedona City Code; providing for a savings clause; and providing for repeal of any ordinance or parts of ordinances or code provisions in conflict herewith. Seconded by Councilor Jablow. Vote: Motion carried with six (6) in favor (Moriarty, Martinez, Chisholm, Hudson, Jablow, and Williamson) and one (1) opposed (Currivan).

b. Reports/discussion on Council assignments

Councilor Chisholm advised that Sedona Recycles lost a little less than \$10,000 this past month which is a smaller loss than the prior month. Members of the Sedona Recycles Board met with City staff to discuss future collaboration and plans.
