



CITY OF SEDONA ST. PATRICK'S PARADE SAFETY RULES



These rules are provided to create a safe parade experience for participants, spectators and event staff.

Failure to follow these rules may result in immediate removal of your entry from the parade and/or the privilege to participate in future parades. We appreciate your cooperation in continuing to make this a safe and enjoyable community event.

These rules were developed from reviewing accidents from other parades across the United States that resulted in a serious injury or fatality. Fortunately, the Sedona St. Patrick's Parade has not had any serious injuries and we would like to keep that record going with your help and cooperation.

- Entries with animals:
 - Dogs must have proof of a current license. Dogs must be kept on leash and be held by someone strong enough to manage them. Participant is responsible for pet clean-up.
 - Equestrian participants must be at least ten (10) years old and able to manage horse.
 - Animals cannot be left unattended at any time and must be kept under control at all times.
- Motor vehicles may not break traction at any time and not exceed the pace of the walking entrants.
- All entries/floats must be completed BEFORE you arrive at the staging area.
- City of Sedona must be notified at least 72 hours before the parade of any changes (number of people, size and types of vehicles/float etc.) in your entry.
- An entry will be considered a business entry (Business Entry Fee) if any business logo or name appears on any vehicle or float.
- All participants must adhere to the direction of event staff/volunteers.
- Candy & giveaways must be handed out to spectators. **NOT ALLOWED: THROWING CANDY.** All candy must be in the original wrappers. You **MUST** have walkers in your entry to hand out candy or other items. Handouts (candy or material) **MUST** be placed at the back of the vehicle or float.
- **NOT ALLOWED: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES** may not be consumed prior to or during your participation in parade activities.
