About The NCS™

The National Community Survey™ (The NCS™) report is about the "livability" of Sedona. The phrase "livable community" is used here to evoke a place that is not simply habitable, but that is desirable. It is not only where people do live, but where they want to live.

Great communities are partnerships of the government, private sector, community-based organizations and residents, all geographically connected. The NCS captures residents' opinions considering ten central facets of a community:

- Economy
- Mobility
- Community Design
- Utilities
- Safety
- Natural Environment
- Parks and Recreation
- Health and Wellness
- Education, Arts and Culture
- Inclusivity and Engagement

The Community Livability Report provides the opinions of a representative sample of 608 residents of the City of Sedona. The margin of error around any reported percentage is 4% for all respondents and the response rate for the 2020 survey was 38%. The full description of methods used to garner these opinions can be found in the *Technical Appendices* provided under separate cover.

Overview of Results

Residents feel safe in their neighborhoods and downtown Sedona.

Nearly all Sedona residents gave high marks to the overall feeling of safety in the city, and 85% of residents applicated crime prevention services in their community. About 9 in 10 respondents also reported they felt safe from property and violent crime. All of these measures of a safe city exceeded national averages. Residents' evaluations of animal control services in Sedona were also higher than those in communities nationwide and increased since 2017.

Resident views of local governance and leadership remain stable over time but could be an area of focus.

While aspects related to local governance were given ratings that were either similar to or lower than their national comparisons, almost no changes were observed between 2017 and 2020, even amid the COVID-19 pandemic. Most governance evaluations ranged from between about one-third and one-half of residents offering positive ratings. The highest rated item was overall customer service provided by City employees with 79% offering excellent or good reviews.

There have been small gains in Mobility and it remains an area of opportunity.

Assessments of the overall quality of the transportation system, ease of travel by most modes of transportation (by car, bicycle, and public transit), ease of parking, traffic flow, and bus or transit services were lower than the national benchmarks, with one-third or fewer of respondents assigning positive reviews. From 2017 to 2020, evaluations of traffic enforcement, snow removal, traffic flow, ease of travel by car and by bicycle, and the overall public transportation system declined. On a more positive note, more residents favorably rated street repair and street cleaning over this time. Additionally, residents' reported levels of walking or biking instead of driving were higher than levels reported in 2017 and above average. Sedona community members' ratings for sidewalk maintenance services were exceptional and also higher than national comparisons. Survey respondents were asked about their support for the implementation of a robust transit system for locals and visitors and about 8 in 10 strongly or somewhat supported this proposal; further, about two-thirds of respondents also supported extending the transportation sales tax to support this endeavor.

Sedona residents praise the City as a place to visit as well as its natural environment and outdoor amenities.

Sedona as a place to visit (90% excellent or good), was rated much higher than national averages. About 9 in 10 City residents awarded high scores to the overall quality of the natural environment, and around 8 in 10 appreciated the availability of paths and walking trails and recreational opportunities; all of these ratings surpassed those given elsewhere nationwide. When asked how well the City was doing being a place invested in protecting the natural environment, about two-thirds of residents felt the City was doing an excellent or good job. Further, Sedona respondents were more likely than those who lived in other communities to rate the overall quality of the natural environment in the community as essential or very important.

Facets of Livability

Ratings of importance were compared to ratings of quality to help guide City staff and officials with decisions on future resource allocation and strategic planning areas. When competition for limited resources demands that efficiencies or cutbacks be instituted, it is wise not only to know what facets are deemed most important to residents' quality of life, but which among the most important are perceived to be of relatively lower quality in your community. It is these facets of community livability – more important facets perceived as being of lower quality – to which attention needs to be paid first.

Measuring community livability starts with assessing the quality of life of those who live there, and ensuring that the community is attractive, accessible, and welcoming to all.




FIGURE 3: QUALITY OF LIFE IN SEDONA




FIGURE 4: QUALITY OF LIFE IN SEDONA - SUMMARY







FIGURE 7: GOVERNMENT PERFORMANCE AND SERVICES - SUMMARY




FIGURE 9: ECONOMIC HEALTH - SUMMARY




FIGURE 12: MOBILITY IN SEDONA




FIGURE 13: USE OF ALTERNATIVE TRANSPORTATION MODES




FIGURE 14: MOBILITY IN SEDONA - SUMMARY

OVERALL DESIGN OR LAYOUT OF SEDONA'S RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL AREAS




FIGURE 16: COMMUNITY DESIGN




FIGURE 17: COMMUNITY DESIGN - SUMMARY




FIGURE 19: UTILITES - SUMMARY




FIGURE 20: SAFETY IN SEDONA




FIGURE 21: SAFETY-RELATED SERVICES - SUMMARY






FIGURE 25: PARKS AND RECREATION






FIGURE 27: HEALTH AND WELLNESS




FIGURE 28: HEALTH AND WELLNESS - SUMMARY




FIGURE 30: EDUCATION, ARTS AND CULTURE




FIGURE 31: EDUCATION, ARTS AND CULTURE - SUMMARY




FIGURE 32: INCLUSIVITY AND ENGAGEMENT




FIGURE 33: INCLUSIVITY AND ENGAGEMENT - SUMMARY




FIGURE 35: RESIDENTS' PARTICIPATION IN LAST 12 MONTHS- SUMMARY




FIGURE 38: PERCEPTIONS OF TOURISM IN SEDONA

In the future, how much of a role would you like to see tourism have in Sedona's economy?




FIGURE 39: SOURCES OF INFORMATION

Please indicate how likely or unlikely you are to use each of the following sources to learn about City issues, activities, events and services.




FIGURE 40: PARTICIPATION IN LOCAL ACTIVITES

In the last 12 months, about how many times, if at all, have you or other household members done each of the following in Sedona?




FIGURE 41: SUPPORT FOR MASS TOURISM-RELATED TRANSIT

How much would you support or oppose the City implementing a robust transit system for locals and visitors?




FIGURE 42: SUPPORT FOR EXTENDING TRANSIT SYSTEM SALES TAX
