



Walkability






- Staff will facilitate meetings and take notes.
- The Group will operate on a consensus basis.
- The group is expected to meet over a 2-year period.
- Members will be asked to commit to regular meetings once a month with occasional meetings on a more frequent basis, as needed.
- Meetings will occur during City business hours Monday through Thursday, 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- Meetings will be a maximum of two hours in length.
- Members will be asked to assist with and attend community outreach events, which may occur outside regular business hours.



Consensus is:

- "Bringing people together to express their ideas, clarify areas of agreement and disagreement and develop shared resolutions.
- Consensus-building does not mean everyone agrees that a decision is optimal. It means a decision is reached that everyone can live with; in other words, the decision addresses stakeholders' most important issues."


