SUMMARY STATEMENT

Background: The City's housing study prepared in November 2020 identified an affordable housing gap of approximately 1,500 households including the existing demand of 1,260 units and the future employment demand of 250+/- units. The housing crisis has been exacerbated even further since the study's completion with median home sales price in Sedona rising over \$900,000. There is also historically low inventory of housing for sale or lease.

The Affordable Housing Action Plan which resulted from the housing study recommended a five-year effort to address affordable housing. The first objective of the Action Plan is: "Encourage development of affordable housing units that meet the needs of low- and moderate-income households. In order to be effective, this objective requires the active recruitment of affordable housing developers by the City." Multiple developers are seeking opportunities to work with the City to address the affordable housing issue. Most of the potential sites developers and staff have identified are not zoned for multi-family housing, and as such, would require Council's approval for rezoning. As the rezoning process has historically created barriers to development, the goal in this session is to identify levels of density and types of development which Council deems appropriate for proposed sites.

The Action Plan recommends a multi-pronged approach to the shortage of affordable housing. And, as time is of the essence, staff has studied models from other cities

experiencing a workforce housing shortage which could provide a more immediate supply of affordable units. The three programs staff recommends include 1. Purchasing Deed Restrictions from existing property owners, 2. Incentivizing residents to provide long-term leases for the local workforce, and 3. Providing limited short-term emergency housing vouchers until new-construction helps ease the demand. Each of these programs would be designed to meet the Sedona market with a set of rules and restrictions to limit eligibility and maximize the value of the subsidy provided. The goal in this session is to determine Council's appetite for public subsidy programs of this kind and identify acceptable eligibility criteria.
