





Education Materials







1. READY: "PREPARE NOW"

- ☐ Be aware of hazards that threaten your community.
- ☐ Create defensible space around your home by clearing 30 to 100 feet of vegetation to protect it from fire.
- ☐ Build an emergency go kit with enough food, water and emergency supplies for 72 hours.
- ☐ Write a family communication and evacuation plan.

2. SET: "BE ALERT"

- ☐ There is significant danger in your area.
- Consider voluntarily relocating to a shelter or with family/friends outside the affected area.
- Stay aware of the latest news and information from public safety officials.

3. GO: "EVACUATE"

- Danger in your area is imminent and lifethreatening. Take your emergency go kit and evacuate immediately to a shelter or with family, friends outside the affected area.
- Follow instructions from emergency personnel and stay on designed evacuation routes.




T.H.I.R.A.

Threat & Hazard Identification Risk Analysis

- What threats & hazards can affect our community?
- If they occurred, what impacts would those threats
 & hazards have on our community?
- Based on those impacts, what capabilities should our community have?
 - Recommended every 3-years
 - Estimated 4-6 months completion
 - Project cost reimbursement funding approved through DEMA
