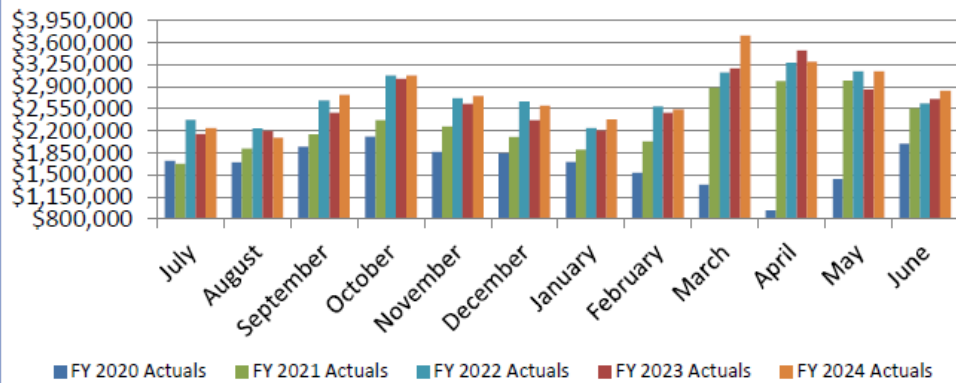

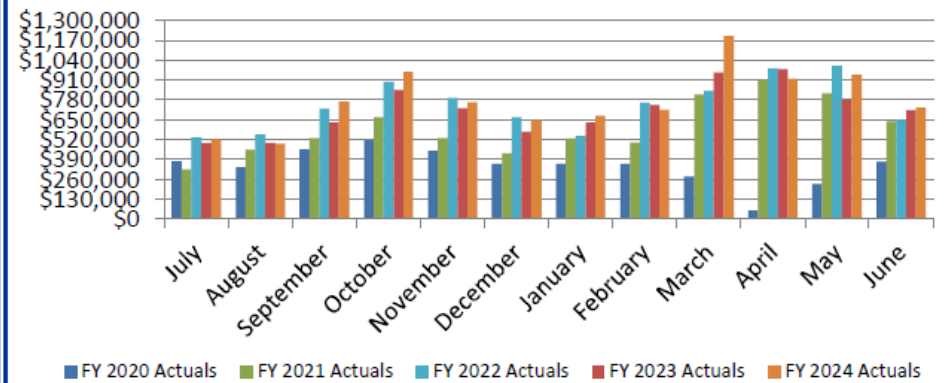


Historical Trends

Bed Tax Revenues Historical Trends

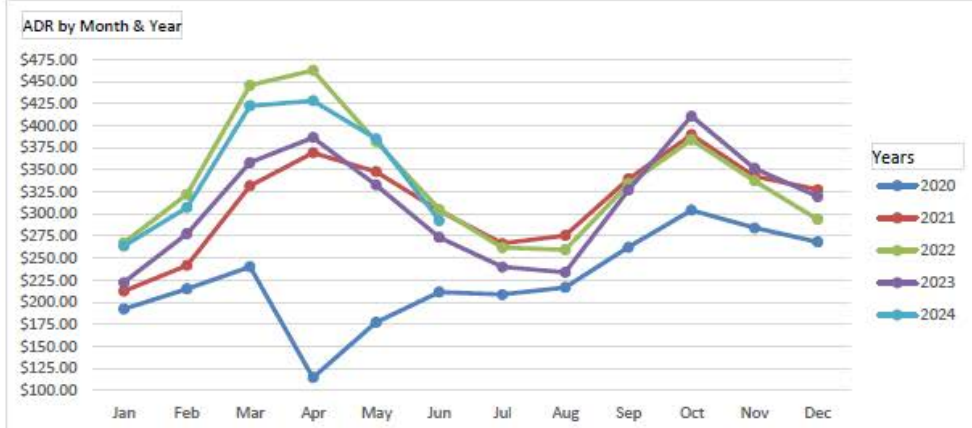
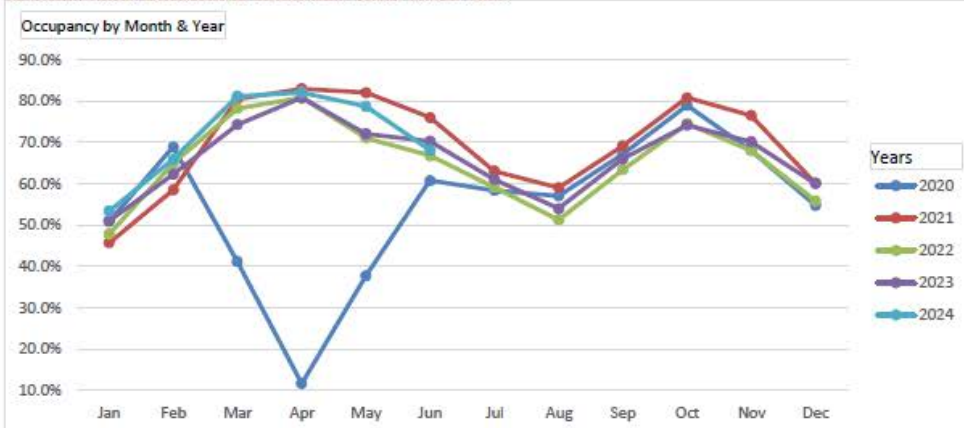

SCTC Section 8-100. General Definitions.

"Hotel" means any public or private hotel, inn, hostelry, tourist home, house, motel, rooming house, apartment house, trailer, or other lodging place within the City offering lodging, wherein the owner thereof, for compensation, furnishes lodging to any transient, except foster homes, rest homes, sheltered care homes, nursing homes, or primary health care facilities.

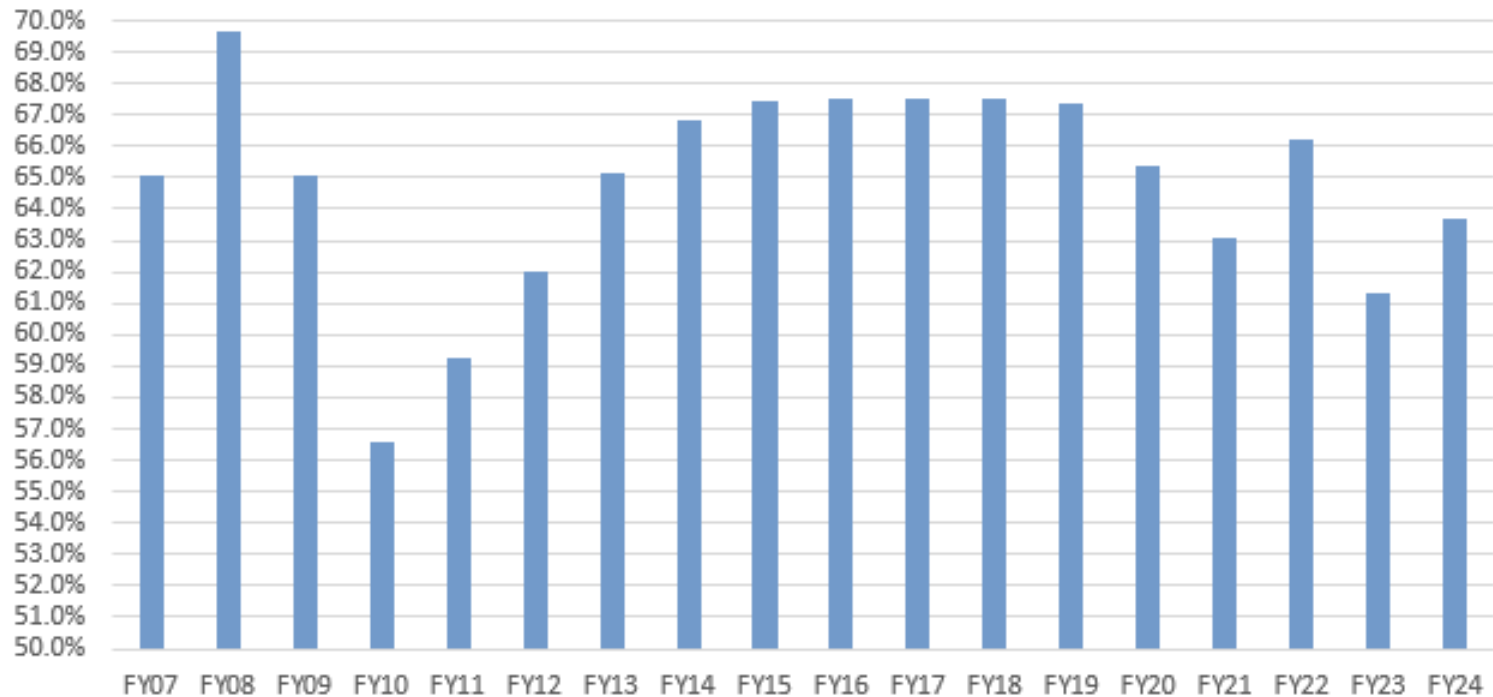
"Lodging (Lodging Space)" means any room or apartment in a hotel or any other provider of rooms, trailer spaces, or other residential dwelling spaces; or the furnishings or services and accommodations accompanying the use and possession of said dwelling space, including storage or parking space for the property of said tenant.



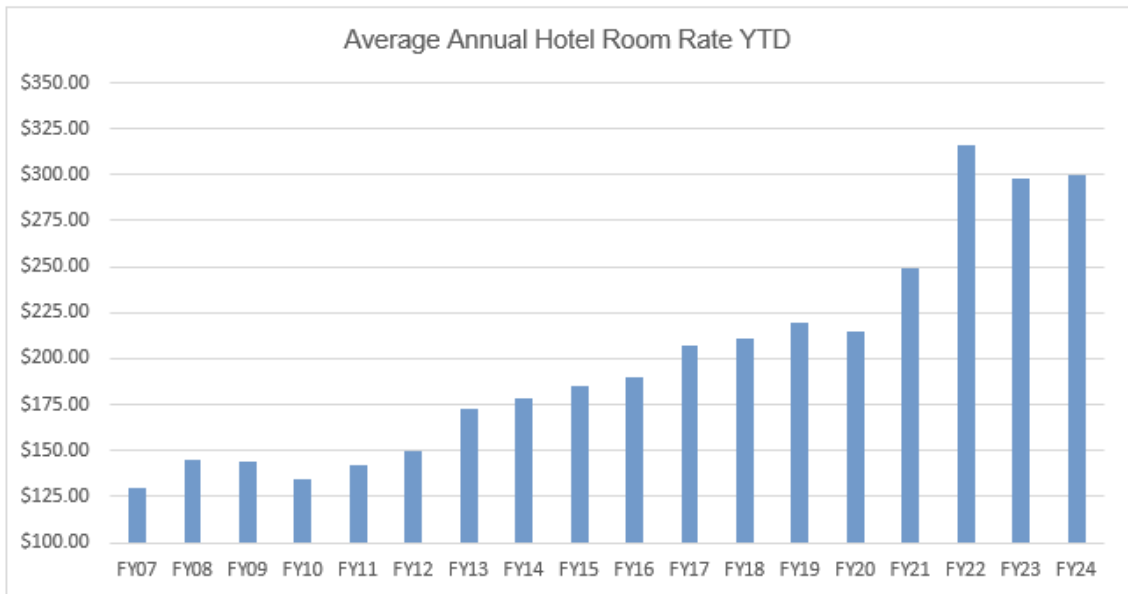
Average Annual Traditional Hotel Occupancy

Average Annual Hotel Occupancy & Average Annual Room Rate as of June

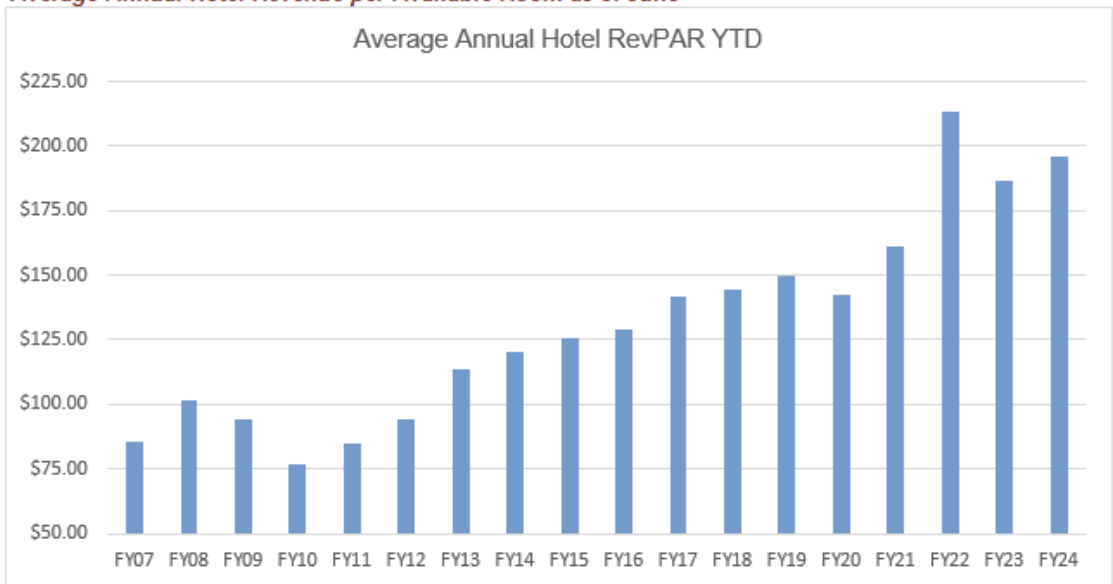
Average Annual Hotel Occupancy YTD

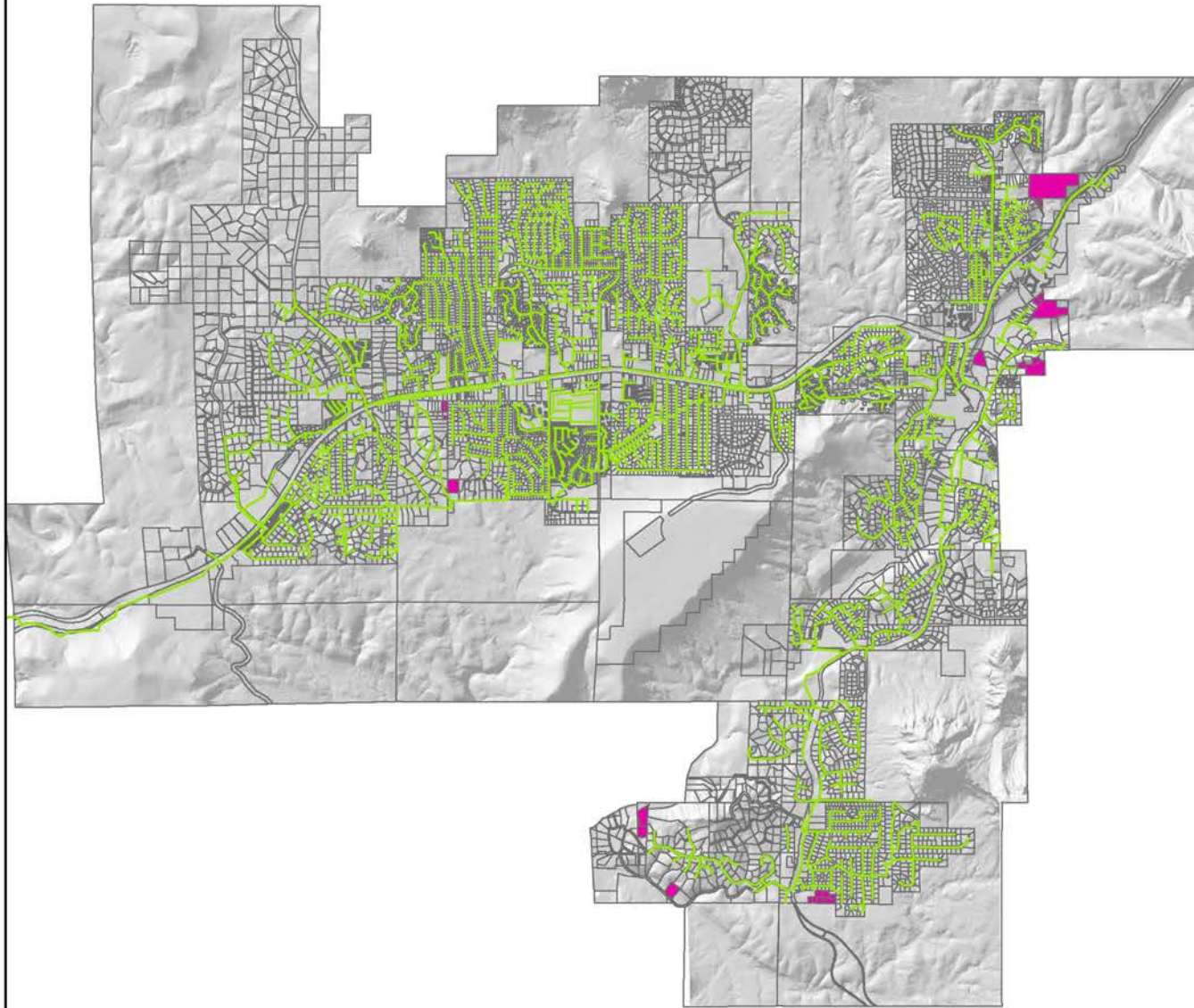
Proposed City Code Amendments

**Title 13 (Public Service & Utilities)
Division 1 Wastewater**

Chapter 13.05.020 – Sewer Availability

- Changes the definition of sewer availability for parcels zoned single-family residence limiting availability to those with 300-feet of a sewer line
 - 25 parcels will no longer be required to connect to sewer upon development but will still have the option to connect at owner's expense
 - Subdivisions, multi-family, commercial, and industrial zoned parcels excluded

Chapter 13.05.020 – Notice of Sewer Availability

- Proposed change allows a deferred connection when sewer becomes available
 - For existing developed properties only
 - Defer up to 4 years
 - Septic must be inspected regularly and to ensure it is functioning properly
 - Required to connect upon expiration of deferment period or failed inspection report



Chapter 13.15.040 – Permits for Service Connections

- Proposed change requires backwater valve to be installed if an elevation difference of less than 12 inches exists between lowest drain and upstream manhole
 - Existing code is a 4-inch elevation difference
 - Provides greater protection for owner



Chapter 13.15.050 – Property Owner’s Responsibility

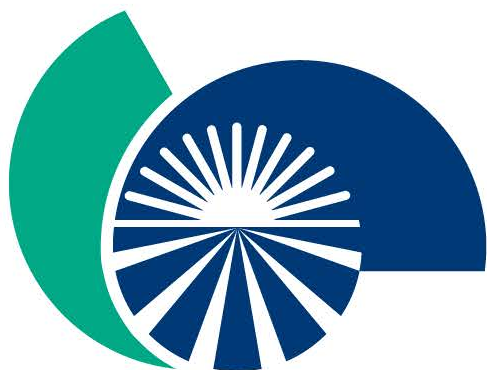
- Proposed change requires installation of sewer clean-out and/or backwater valve (when meeting elevation difference requirement) upon remodel or addition, if one does not already exist.



Miscellaneous Amendments

- City may, but is not obligated to, accept septage for disposal and treatment at the WWRP
- Allowance of director to change frequency of grease-trap maintenance based on observations and/or testing
- Removal of per-seat based billing for restaurants – square footage or water usage-based billing available

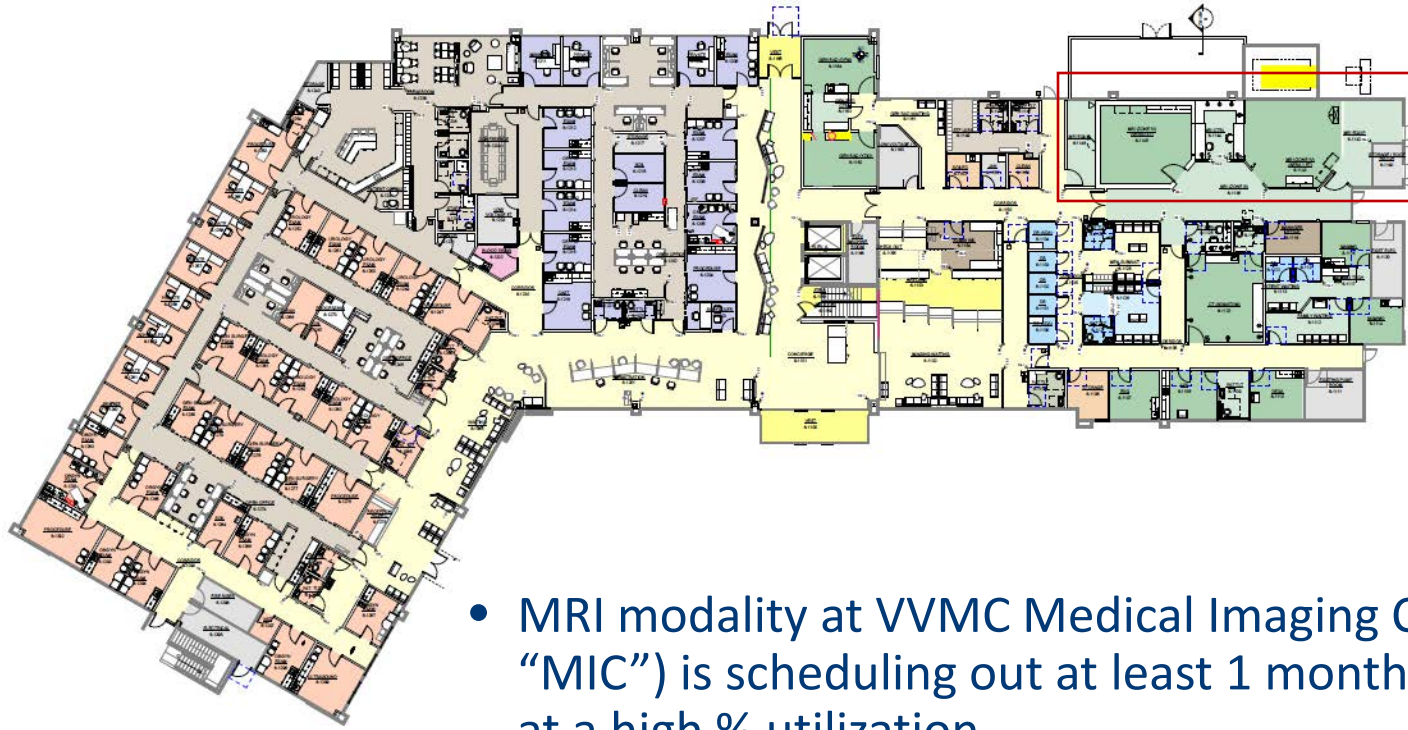
Project Description:

- Installation of new generator and corresponding fuel cell / automatic transfer switches
- Placement of new propane tank
- Tie-in of all new systems infrastructure to VVMC building management system

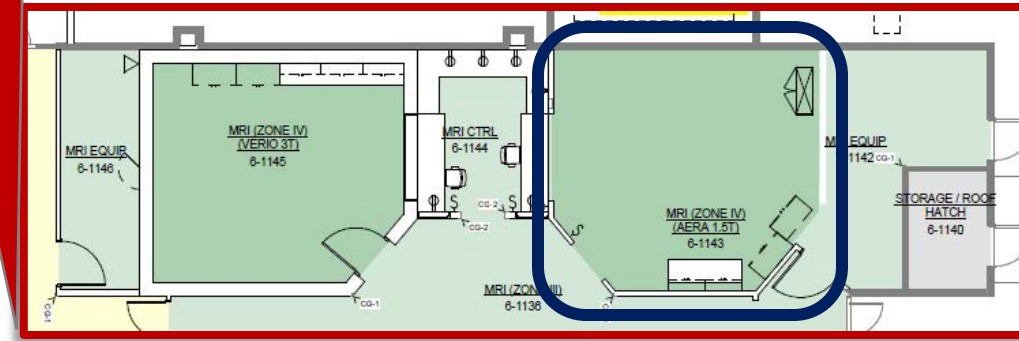
\$10.7M of in-flight infrastructure upgrades that began in 2022 and will be completed in 2025.

- MRI modality at VVMC Medical Imaging Center (aka “MIC”) is scheduling out at least 1 month for MRIs and is at a high % utilization
- Outpatient MRI overflow from MIC happening at VVMC and can impact Inpatient and ED throughput
- Existing MRI shell space exists within the department for this purpose

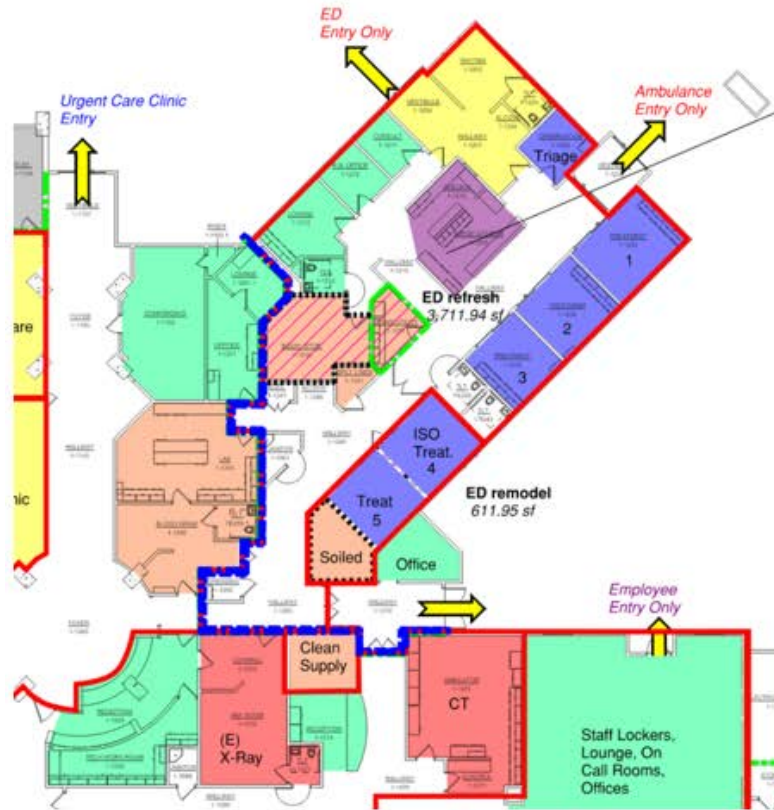

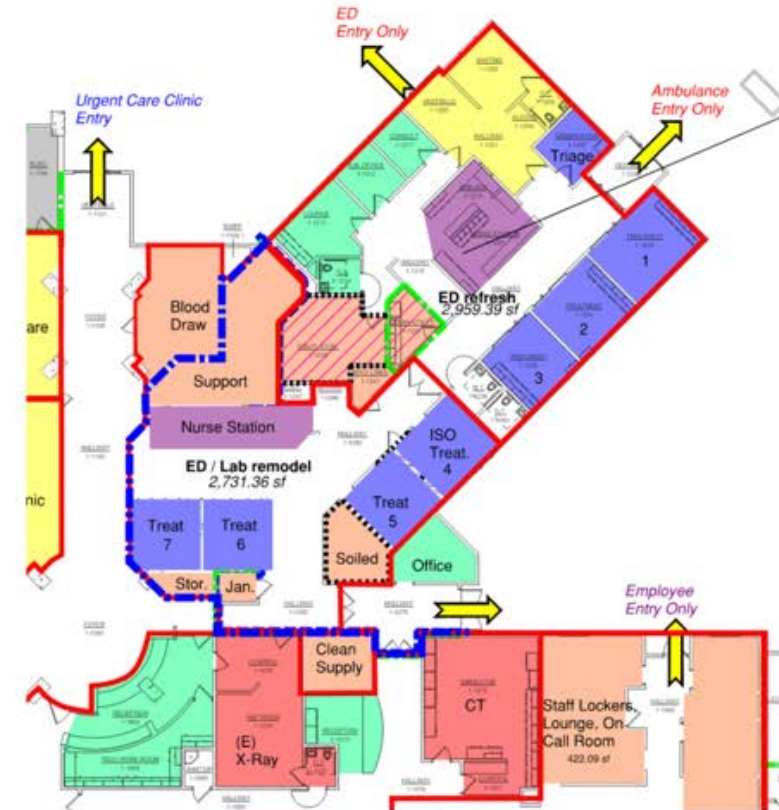

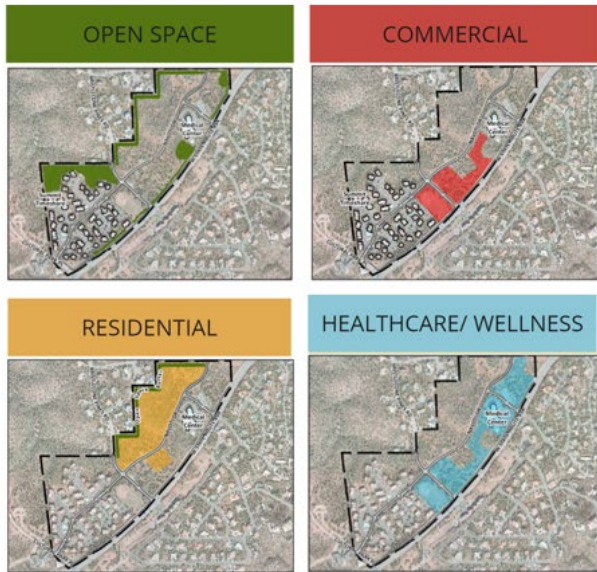
